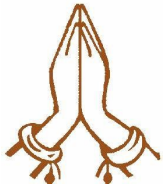

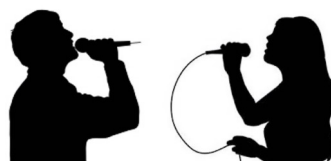

Woodnesborough Village Hall Update

We are pleased that the Hall is fully functioning again.

Besides the regular bookings we host many birthday parties, christenings, wedding receptions and other family events.

Our aim is to keep the Hall accessible to all through the hire costs we charge. The best way to make an enquiry is by email. Please remember we are a group of volunteers not a business, so we ask you to be patient and await a response. It takes about 24 hours a month for our volunteers, some of whom work full time, to run the hall. Only our cleaner is paid. Recently volunteers have been disturbed at 10.30 in the evening and on Sunday afternoon by callers using personal numbers.

Our aim is not to make a profit but to cover all expenses. Electricity alone is costing £750 a month. Recently we have added a storage unit mainly for Baby and Toddlers and Gardeners Club. We are refurbishing our kitchen to make it better for functions that need a catering facility. Our fire doors have always been a problem and they will be replaced this year.

Our events team intend to restart quizzes, bingo and fairs from the Autumn so, there is much to look forward to.

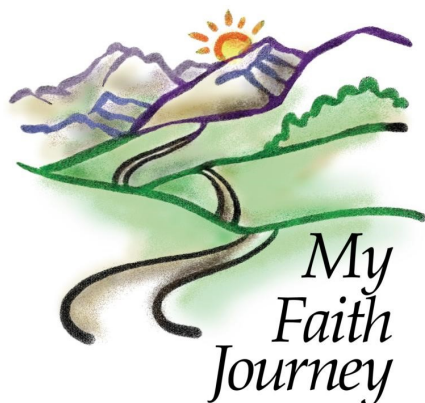

Two names upon the shore.

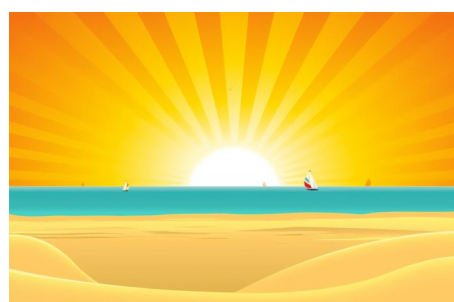
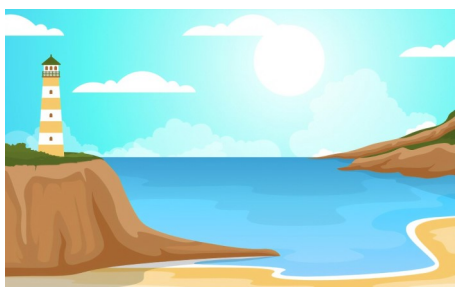
Here, on the level sand,

Woodnesborough Parish Council

Annual Parish Council Meeting 17th May

Roles for councillors were assigned and one sub-committee selected at the meeting. Correspondance to the council was noted. The council discussed the forthcoming Queen's Platinum Jubilee event on 2nd June and the new beacon to be lit, as well as the free commemorative water bottles for all children in the village. One planning application was discussed and one planning decision by DDC noted. A verbal report from the PCSO D. Bishop was received. The Highways Improvement Plan relating to the change in speed limit on Beacon Lane was noted. Matters relating to the village hall and the mowing and maintenance of the triangle at the top of Fir Tree Hill were discussed. The meeting also agreed financial correspondence and payments.

Annual Parish Meeting 24th May

The meeting was attended by a considerable number of members of the public and refreshments were provided. The Chair, Councillor Baker delivered her annual report on the Council's activities over the past year and thanked the councillors, notably Councillor Boniface the Vice Chair and the Parish Clerk Jo Jones. Thanks were given to Councillor Smith who is retiring after many years as a Parish Councillor. District Councillor Friend and County Councillor Chandler presented their annual reports. There were discussions about speed limits around the village and questions were raised by parish councillors and members of the public about why the 30mph speed limit boundaries could not be extended. All these reports are available in full on the Council's website. The speaker was Cllr Simon Mallett who gave a very interesting talk, illustrated with photographs detailing the history of Vine Farm since being mentioned in the Domesday Book to the present day. The Clerk presented the Finance Statement for 2021-22.

Parish Council meeting 28th June

Remaining Councillor roles were allocated. Several planning applications were discussed and one DDC planning decision noted. Various correspondence with the Council was noted. Verbal reports were received by KCC Councillor Chandler and DDC Councillor Friend. Highways issues and matters relating to the Village Hall were noted and discussed. Financial correspondence presented to the council was discussed and actions agreed. The meeting approved various payments.

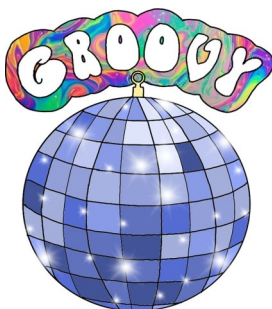

our dedicated helpers, coronation chicken rolls, ice creams, tea and coffee.

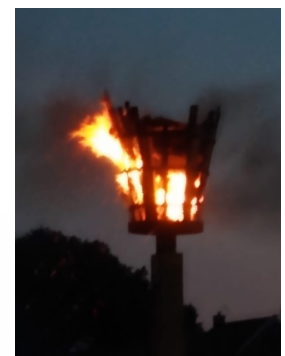
There was a free commemorative Jubilee water bottle for all children who attended. **Any children from Woodnesborough who haven't yet received a water bottle can contact the Parish Council**

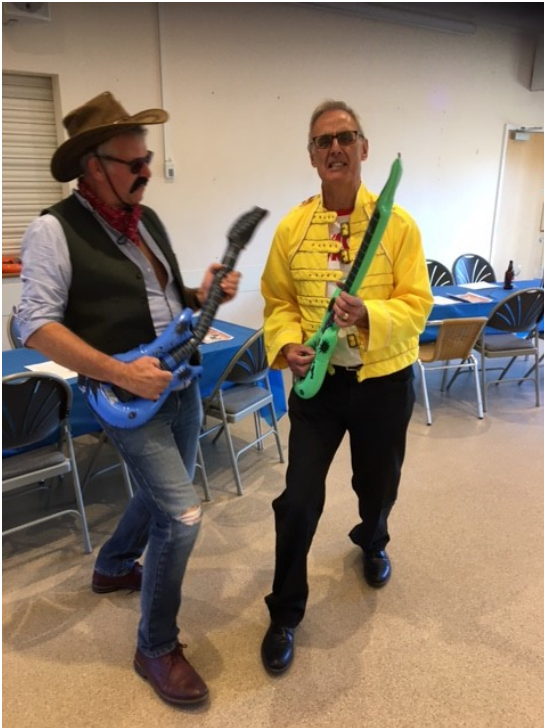

Birding With Big Nick



There are many young birds about at the moment, most species have had at least one brood and the youngsters will be well on their way to being fully fledged. A trip to Restharrow Scrape recently gave me the idea for this column.

There were young birds everywhere and in various stages of development. From an Oystercatcher chick that had almost obtained adult plumage to almost newly hatched Tufted Duck ducklings and various other species as well. It was quite surprising to me just how many birds had made the Scrape their home. Once the vegetation grows up and the birds are nesting out of sight, it is easy to imagine the place is practically deserted, but the number of young birds that were clearly hatched there shows otherwise. 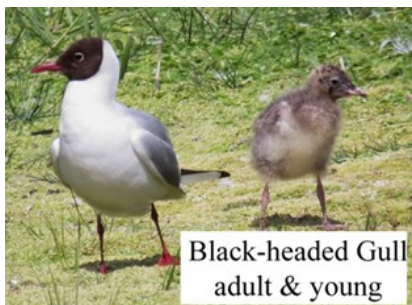

There was much excitement when an Eleanora's Falcon turned up on Worth Marshes at the end of May, it is a very rare sighting in the UK with only 7 accepted records for it in the UK, and this was a first for Kent. It had twitchers (bird watchers and photographers who will travel miles to see a rare bird and add it to their list) arriving from all parts of the country. Someone had driven down from Scotland and another couple had driven through the night from the North East to see it. I went to see it and managed a few distant photographs; other photographers were luckier and got some outstanding shots.

Normally found in the Mediterranean, especially Greece, the Eleanora's Falcon feeds on small birds and dragonflies, it was catching the latter with ease at Worth. Almost unbelievably, at the same time this rare falcon was at Worth, a second scarce falcon was found there; a Red-footed Falcon. Although these Kestrel sized birds do make more regular appearances in the

UK, it was still a superb day for many people, who were able to tick off two rare species at the same location. You never know what might turn up next!

Staple Village Walk (approx. 4 miles/6.5 km, 1 hour 40 mins)



The walk is on the flat but it includes footpaths and fields so may be uneven or muddy in places.

Start at the bridle path opposite the church. (Parking on the road is available). At the end of the hedge on your left-hand side turn left. Approximately 100m after the end of the tree-line, turn right and head diagonally across the field. At the road, cross over and continue over the fields and follow the path around to the left.

At the road, turn right and follow the road past houses. Before the large barn and opposite the track to a cluster of houses, turn left and follow the hedge-line down the edge of the field. At the end of the fence, turn diagonally right across the field. At the road junction, cross over diagonally and continue diagonally across the field. Halfway across the field, take the right-hand fork and continue across the woodland. Head into the woodland to reach a concrete track.

Where the concrete track goes left, go ahead on the track that goes across the scrubland. This eventually bears round to the left to meet the corner of an orchard. Walk along the top edge of the orchard. At the end of the orchard, turn left and cross diagonally across the field and into the next field.



After about 50m turn right down a slope (take care!) and head into another field where you take another diagonal foot path across a field. Continue with the hedge on your right and down the narrow footpath where you may see some pigs on your left beside a thatched cottage. At the road turn left, past the Black Pig public house and then immediately right along Mill Road. Continue past the village hall on your left and Staple Remembrance Garden on the right. Note the birch trees representing the ten lost sons of Staple. Turn right at the T-junction and down Buckland Lane. At the forge, turn into the Street and return to the church.

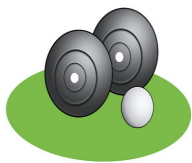

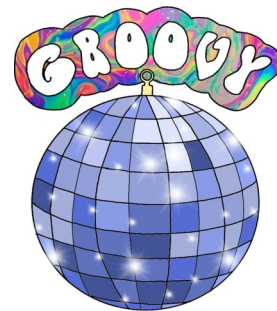
