




You will also find a book in church where you may write a prayer request for yourself, a family member or friend, or a situation.

## **Woodnesborough Parish Council**

The Parish Council met on 26<sup>th</sup> September and 24<sup>th</sup> October and at the September meeting we welcomed our two new copted councillors, Karen Schubert and Tracy Hall and your council is again at full strength.

At both meetings we welcomed several members of the public and our County and District councillors.

We dealt with 2 planning applications at the September meeting but none at the October one. We also noted 4 planning decisions at the September meeting and noted 1 at the October meeting and we also noted that the breach of planning at Marshborough House had now ceased as retrospective permission had now been granted.

We received reports from both our County and District Councillors but there were no reports from our councillors. We also noted correspondence regarding the Richborough waste site, DDC Polling District review and also DDC's Green Infrastructure Strategy consultation. We also discussed several issues relating to highways, including the many recent road closures and also the refurbishment of the bench and noticeboard in the street near the Old Post Office. There were also issues raised regarding several footpaths which we have notified PROW about.

Several issues were discussed under the Village Hall at both meetings including the removal of the gas supply to the hall as it is no longer required and finance was discussed and agreed.

Thank you to all of you who come to our meetings and for taking an interest in your council. Don't forget that you can come along to any of our meetings as we are here to ensure our parishioners are our priority and it's always good to have members of the public at our meetings. 





# Christmas Facts

## Carol singing dates back to the 13th century

Carols were not always about Christmas or even singing, but were a story told to others. The practice of going from house to house to wish people well during the colder months was called wassailing. St. Francis of Assisi took this old custom and added religious lyrics to well- known tunes, turning it into what we call carol singing today.

## Christmas wasn't always on 25th December

While Christmas marks the birth of Jesus Christ, the date of the big event is not known. Many historians believe that Jesus was most likely born in the spring, not 25<sup>th</sup> December. The date of the festival may have been chosen because it coincided with Saturnalia, a pagan festival honouring Saturn, the agricultural god.

## Boxing Day is only celebrated in a few countries

Boxing Day falls on the 26th December and is celebrated by several countries, including the United Kingdom, Australia, Canada and New Zealand. This tradition dates back to the 1800s when the rich would let their servants have a day off to go home.

## Letting your heir down?

Britons are ignoring estate planning tools that could help them to pass on more of their estate to the next generation.

Over recent years, property inflation and rising asset values have combined to push a higher proportion of estates over the nil-rate band for Inheritance Tax (IHT). The residence nil-rate band helps to a degree, but with the IHT threshold frozen at £325,000 per individual, and government receipts still rising, IHT is not a tax just for the rich or even moderately wealthy.

Despite the fact that more estates are paying IHT, there are ways to prevent families paying over the odds. For example, those with sufficient assets to trigger an IHT liability when they pass away could use the exemption which allows anyone to give away up to £3,000 worth of gifts each tax year without them being included in the value of their estate.

However, a lack of awareness about what does or doesn't form part of an estate could result in their families paying more IHT than they need to. Another way to minimise the impact of IHT is to take out a 'whole of life' insurance policy. This pays a lump sum on death, and when the policy is written in trust, the pay-out can help offset or eliminate an IHT bill.

## Heir care

Whilst inertia and ignorance of estate planning is good news for the Treasury, which relies on it to ensure its tax receipts, the widespread lack of knowledge will worry many potential heirs. But taking the appropriate advice can go a long way to alleviating those concerns.

A financial adviser can help families with the transfer of wealth in an orderly and tax-efficient manner, establishing trusts, life insurance and so on, while also ensuring that the person who is arranging their estate has enough income to maintain their normal standard of living.
