- 1. The name of February comes from the ancient Roman purification festival of Februarius which took place on February 15.
- 2. The Anglo-Saxons called it "solmonath" (the month of mud or wet sand).
- 3. February is the only month that can pass without a full moon. This last happened in 2018.
- 4. The birthstone of February is the amethyst; the birth flower is the violet or common primrose.
- 5. February frequently occurs in lists of the most commonly misspelt words in the English language.

# And now, apart from celebrating St David's Day, St Patrick's Day and Mother's Day, what else is March known for? Here we present... some intriguing facts about March.

- 1. March is named after Mars, the Roman god of war as it was the month in which the military campaigning season got under way after winter.
- 2. In Old English one name for the month of March was "Hlyda" meaning "loud" possibly because of the roaring March winds.
- 3. An old proverb says that "March comes in a like a lion and goes out like a lamb", which means that winter is ending and spring is beginning.
- 4. More 20th century UK Prime Ministers had birthdays in March than any other month.
- 5. The expression "mad as a March hare" dates back to 1529. It refers to the wild behaviour of male hares during the mating season in March.



Reports were received from County and District Councillors. Various matters relating to the Village Hall and Green and forthcoming events were discussed.

Actions relating to Highways were agreed. Work on the Highways Improvement Plan (HIP) will take place to extend the 30mph limit on Beacon Lane. Matters relating to Finance were discussed and payments approved.

# Woodnesborough winter walk – 2 miles approx.



We have included this walk before and I'm sure it will be familiar to many people but it may be new to others.

From car park at Woodnesborough Village Hall on Elmwood Park take the FP to the left side of the Village Hall and turn right on lane. Just after playing field take FP on right to meet Church Street. Turn right and follow Church Street straight ahead past the cottages and past Woodnesborough Church on left.

Turn right, crossing Fir Tree Hill with care and continue on Foxborough Hill to crossroads. Cross road and turn left on Beacon Lane. After the last of the new houses on right take FP that goes between gardens. Go through iron gate, cross lane and continue on FP passing Woodnesborough Beacon on left. Continue ahead on FP passing Southern Water buildings and telecom mast on left. Follow FP with lovely views either side to junction with bridleway.

Turn right on bridleway and follow it to Green Lane Farm, then go through gate onto Marshborough Road. Turn right on road and cross with care, then just after thatched Honeypot Cottage, where road bends right, between the 2 bend signs, take lane that goes straight ahead (NOT Farm Lane to the left). Follow lane passing Vine Farm on left. Continue on lane and pass Parsonage Farm on left. Continue to follow FP that goes straight ahead through orchard and through a gap in the hedge into a small alleyway to reach The Street. Stop and cross the road with care then take the lane almost opposite next to Stoneleigh.



Take FP on right back to the Village Hall car park.

## **Birding With Big Nick**

For various reasons I haven't managed to get out much with my camera over the last month or so, but I did make a brief visit to Restharrow Scrape at Sandwich Bay the other day, which gave me the inspiration for this column.

At this time of year the Scrape is home to many birds that move south for winter, species such as Lapwing, Greylag Geese, Curlew and several species of duck – Shoveler, Tufted Duck, Gadwall, Mallard and lots of Teal (often numbering several hundreds).

Every now and then something spooks the birds and they rapidly take to the air in a great flurry of splashing and wing beats; circling overhead until they perceive the danger has passed, they will then return to the Scrape. Sometimes it's difficult to know what has disturbed them, but it is always worth looking out for a bird of prey in the area, commonly the cause for their panic.

seen when they are out in the open feeding, by probing the wet ground with their long bills for worms and grubs. If they are resting up in the clumps of grass and reeds you might easily miss them, their stripy brown and yellowish plumage is very effective camouflage. However, spend a few minutes searching the vegetation on the little islands and you may suddenly see one – and then another, and another. Once

you've 'got your eye in' you realise there are quite a few. On one occasion, having spent some time searching through binoculars, I established there were probably 25 Common Snipe in the undergrowth. Suddenly a military jet fighter screamed overhead and put all the birds into the air. As birds tend to flock together roughly by species this gave me an opportunity to count them – there were 75 Snipe. That's 3 times the number I'd managed to find on the

ground!

If you are very lucky you may see a Jack Snipe, a little smaller than the Common Snipe with a shorter bill and quite noticeable golden stripes down its back. They have a very peculiar habit of constantly bobbing up and down as if on a spring – the reason for which is unknown, but the movement can often be the first thing that gives them away to an observer. They breed in the far north of Europe and Russia, spending their winters

anywhere from the UK, across Europe and into tropical Africa. One or two turn up at the Scrape most years, you just have to be there at the right time.



Speaking about the MEET, EAT and HEAT campaign, Age Concern Sandwich's Chief Officer, Janet Baker said: The winter months are often difficult for many people. With the increased fuel and food costs over recent months, and now increased energy costs, we are very concerned that many elderly people will struggle to make ends meet. We do not want to see any of our local residents feel lonely and having to choose between heating their home or eating a meal. By offering a healthy meal in a warm environment in the company of others, we want to let our local community know that Age Concern Sandwich can help them."

Age Concern Sandwich is based in the heart of the local community with the Centre providing a caring and friendly environment where people can meet up and join in with the many services and activities offered. The charity also has two shops which are regularly stocked with a variety of bargains.

We provide help, advice and information on issues affecting older people, and offer support to those who may require assistance with forms.

No membership needed - everyone over 50 is welcome. Simply drop in and have a chat over a cup of coffee. The Centre is open weekdays from 9am-4pm (closed Bank Holidays/Christmas).

Volunteers are always needed and welcome to join our friendly team. If you would like to help with any of our services, we would love to hear from you.

**Become a Befriender -** If you have some spare time, enjoy chatting to others, are empathetic and a good listener, then why not become a Befriender. As people get older, some find they spend more time on their own. This can sometimes feel lonely and boring, or make people miss friends or family. We offer a telephone befriending service for older people so they can enjoy chatting with someone over the phone. As a volunteer, you would befriend someone who is 50 or over. From the comfort of your home, it's a fun, safe, and easy way to get to know someone new. Befriending can mean the world to people who feel lonely and isolated, so if you'd like to make a difference to an older person's life please do get in touch.



## Woodnesborough Police News Update

I'd like to start by wishing you all a happy new year and I hope you have had a lovely break over the festive

period, after such a busy period we're now all settling down and starting a new year and making sense of the struggles we all face.

We are or most of us know somebody that is in need of support whether that's mental health related or help with groceries and or help in general with household bills.

In Sandwich on a MONDAY afternoon from 1pm in St Peter's Church you can access the Pantry, this is open to anybody who needs help with food, please pop along and get the information. You can pay a small amount for a large bag of food both fridge and packet groceries, once you have added your name to the list you can come along every week and chose the item which they have on offer. Everyone is catered for and all are welcome.

Age Concern is open from Monday – Friday 9am – 3pm for the over 50s and will provide a warm space, a cup of tea and a friendly smile and chat for those in need of some company, meals at the centre are £7.50 for two courses and are served daily from 12.15 and 1.15pm. Please contact on 01304 614237, alternatively you can go to the website and look at the events page that tells you the week's programme.

Also on a Thursday morning from 10-12 in the Guildhall area myself and the KCC Warden Peter Gill are still holding our weekly surgeries for anyone who may need some help or advice, we would love to see you so please pop along if you can, if not there will be a Police Surgery in Eastry Village Hall on every other Friday.

The main issue that's seems to be occurred in the local areas again has been vehicle crime. Please be aware this can happen anywhere, drives car parks, open spaces, when shopping or parked up at home, but a few simple preventative measures can help and deter the thieves from targeting your property.

- 1. Always lock it
- 2. Close windows and the sunroof to prevent 'fishing'
- 3. Secure your number plates with tamper-resistant screws
- 4. Fit locking, anti-tamper wheel nuts to secure alloy wheels
- 5. Secure anything that's on the outside of your vehicle Anything left on roof-racks, tailgate racks, holiday top boxes or in tool chests

are easily stolen when the vehicle is parked. The use of cable locks, padlocks and self-locking tools chests, which are secured to the vehicle, makes them more secure, but still, don't leave things in them if you can avoid it.

- 7. Hide electrical items and leave no clues
- 8. Tool theft from vans

Vans are often targeted by thieves for the tools stored inside. If you have to leave tools in a van overnight, it's a good idea to mark them clearly with your name / company name and address using paint pens and seal with a clear lacquer spray. Alternatively, you can use a variety of other property marking systems. Items that are clearly marked are less desirable and more difficult to sell on.

Consider using a lockable cabinet within your van to store tools – a number of security rated products are available. Small cameras are also designed to record inside vehicles.

You can also take photographs of items of value, make a note of the serial numbers and consider registering them online at a property register site. I hope that these few updates will help someone and if you need help then please attend the surgeries and ask us to signpost you in a direction for help, stay safe and be alert.


